### **Re-accreditation procedure of EUROTAS Transpersonal Institutes (EUTI)**

- 1) Re-accreditation process takes place after seven years from the accreditation. The ESTP/ECCA Committee will inform the EUTI in advance about the time of the re-accreditation (key date is the date of initial accreditation as EUTI)
- 2) Each EUTI that enters the re-accreditation procedure should fill in the Questionnaire for re-accreditation of EUTIs, which should be sent to the EUROTAS Office by e-mail@eurotas.org to the Coordinator of ESTP/ECCA Committee.
- 3) The Coordinator checks carefully the documents and if necessary asks for additional documents or clarification from EUTI, after which the Coordinator recommends re-accreditation to the ESTP/ECCA.
- 4) At each ESTP/ECCA meeting, ESTP/ECCA members discuss the re-accreditation and decide by majority of votes.
- 5.1) In the case of positive evaluation EUTI is informed by the Coordinator about successful re-accreditation process.
- 5.2) In the case that ESTP/ECCA members do not vote for reaccreditation process due to: changes in the training program that are not in accordance with ESTP training level or involvement of EUTI in the ethical or legal problems that seriously compromise the functioning of EUTI, the representative of EUTI could be invited to attend the next ESTP/ECCA meeting.
- 5.3) After the meeting with EUTI's representative ESTP/ECCA members decide on acceptance of re-accreditation or withdrawal of EUTI's status or re-accrediting institute with certain conditions to be fulfilled within agreed and realistic period of time.
- 5.4) In the case of conditional re-accreditation, the Coordinator follows the fulfilment of conditions while EUTI regularly informs the Coordinator and ESTP/ECCA of the achieved progress. If conditions are achieved within the agreed time the conditional re-accreditation automatically becomes full re-accreditation.
- 6) The re-accreditation fee is 150,- euro.
